### suffixes

-(e)s plural-(e)p past-(e)š future-(e)g negative-(e)k genitive

verb suffix order: past - future - negative noun suffix order: plural - genitive

#### verbs

verbs are converted into bare forms, e.g.:

be, is, am, are  $\rightarrow$  ba have, has  $\rightarrow$  huva eat, eats  $\rightarrow$  aut

participles change into bare forms only when used in progressive/perfect verbs:

is speaking → ba spauk
has spoken → huva spauk
has been speaking → huva ba spauk
a speaking cat → u spaukeň kut
a spoken word → u spikan vird

# questions

yes/no questions: put 'di' before sentence other questions: formed like indirect questions

you are happy. → ya ba hupi.
are you happy? → di ya ba hupi?
why you are happy → vai ya ba hupi
why are you happy? → vai ya ba hupi?
