suffixes

-(e)s plural

-(e)p past

verb suffix order: past - future - negative

noun suffix order: plural - genitive

verbs

verbs are converted into bare forms, e.g.:

be, is, am, are → ba

have, has → huva

eat, eats → aut

participles change into bare forms only when used in progressive/perfect verbs:

is speaking → ba spauk

has spoken → huva spauk

has been speaking → huva ba spauk

a speaking cat → u spaukeñ kut

a spoken word → u spikan vird

questions

yes/no questions: put 'di' before sentence

other questions: formed like indirect questions

you are happy. → ya ba hupi.

are you happy? → di ya ba hupi?

why you are happy → vai ya ba hupi

why are you happy? → vai ya ba hupi?
